**Notes from the Pastor's Desk**

**CEMETERY NOTES ...** As mentioned in last weekend's bulletin and during my homily, it has come to our attention that we may need to rethink a few of the rules which were approved at our last Pastoral Council Meeting in May. Many of these rules have been in place in our cemetery for many, many years and were never enforced. We are willing to be a bit flexible in this regard, but it is important to note that we must and will need to enforce rules in our cemetery. Rules are needed, for the most part, for safety reasons, but also to ease in the upkeep of the property. What some do not realize is that everyone does not tend to their lots in the same fashion and while some are maintained daily, others are not. These rules will be revisited at our next Council meeting in June. **What needs to be clarified at this time is that many think that they own their cemetery property. This is not the case. When a lot is purchased, an easement is given to the purchaser which gives them the right to be buried in that lot. The property is still owned by the Church.**

**CEMETERY REMINDERS ...** Please note that monuments and foundations are the responsibility of the owners. If some damage occurs, for example, from vandalism that is not the fault of the cemetery, one's homeowner's insurance kicks in. However, if the ground on which the markers stand or lie causes the stone to tip or sink, or the monuments or foundations have been damaged by cemetery workers, then it becomes the responsibility of the cemetery. Because endowed care (perpetual care) exists for the purpose of keeping up the property; that is, mowing and trimming of the grass, etc., these additional repairs to the foundations can be costly and additional funds may need to be raised to cover these expenses.

**ST. PATRICK'S CEMETERY RULES AND REGULATIONS ...** Flowers may be planted in front of monuments, preferably protected by paving stones, not to exceed **10 inches** from the front of the monument foundation. (These paving stones can be placed in a straight or curved fashion, but must not exceed the 10 inches allowed). Shrubs, bushes, trees and perennials are not permitted.

**Artificial flowers may be placed on the monuments only and are not permitted in the ground.** This has always been a rule in our cemetery and once again this year there is an abundance of artificial flowers in the ground. We ask that you remove them yourself as soon as possible or we will have to remove them. Artificial flowers are considered "on the monument" if they are in an appropriate (durable) pot that touches the monument or of a size that can be placed on the monument foundation. Also, please do not place any glass containers on the lots as they may break and cause damage to cemetery equipment.

Lastly, starting on July 1, 2010, the cost of a cemetery lot, including endowed care, will increase to \$400 and the cost to open and close a grave will also increase to \$400. Opening and closing of cremation graves will increase to \$125.

**ST. JOSEPH'S CEMETERY REMINDER ...** Flowers, flags, etc. will be permitted on the ground only on Memorial Day and must be removed by the third day after the holiday. The rest of the year they will be permitted only on the monuments and out of the way for mowing of the grass. No permanent flowers are to be planted.

Starting on July 1, 2010, the cost of a cemetery lot, including endowed care, will increase to \$400 and the cost to open and close a grave will also increase to \$400. Opening and closing of cremation graves will increase to \$125.
